Our Services

LEGAL ASSISTANCE & INVESTIGATIONS

We provide people with disabilities with free legal services in order to help them fight disability-related issues related to health, safety, and community integration.

We conduct investigations and monitoring activities to protect the rights of people with disabilities who live in institutions.

COMMUNITY ADVOCACY

Through our non-legal advocacy programs, we:

- Protect & advocate for the rights & safety of people with developmental disabilities living in group homes and in the community with home health & independent living supports.
- Support individuals with disabilities with removing barriers to employment & financial security.
- Ensure that individuals who receive help managing their Social Security benefits are treated fairly.

How We Decide What Cases We Take

Since demand for our services exceeds the capacity of our staff, cases are selected based on available resources & must fit within our priority areas. If we cannot help you directly, we will provide you with information & referrals.

Generally, we take on cases in which we can help remove disability-related barriers to:

- Public services, housing & disaster relief;
- Autonomy and self-direction;
- Quality education,
- Competitive employment;
- Voting opportunities;
- Home and community-based healthcare services; and
- Safety from physical and financial abuse and neglect.
